Talking to men for God is a great thing," declared E. M. Bounds, "but talking to God for men is greater still." Intercession is placing emphasis on others, rather than pleading for ourselves. Man, by nature, is a selfish creature caring little for others, but intercessors we must have a great concern for others.

Moses knew well the role of the intercessor. On one occasion his prayer reached intensified proportions while he interceded for God's children. Israel was warned to cease its constant bickering. Time and again warnings came as Jehovah cried, "I shall destroy them." But, mark one fact: Moses cared! Using every ounce of his strength, he prayed, "Please, O God, forgive them." You can see hot tears flow freely down Moses' ace, as he begs, "Blot my name from Your great book-kill me of You wish-but please forgive Your people."

Abraham was another great intercessor. His intercession for Sodom and Gomorrah and his act of rescuing his nephew Lot from the enemies show how much he cared for people and the bondage they are in.

Anyone praying and acting this intensely had learned the meaning of intercession. Let us train ourselves to become such intercessors for the Lord.
